

An interview is a bit like a conversation except that you have an aim in mind and vou have planned how to achieve that aim with the help of the person you are interviewing.

The key is to ask open questions. Those are questions that encourage the person to give long answers.

HOW TO ... carry out a successful interview

Before you start

Think carefully about what you want to know and how this person can help you find it out.

Write some questions and take an audio recorder so you can listen to the interview again.

Questions...Questions...

- Avoid closed questions, which can be answered with a simple yes or no - those are boring!
- Ask open questions beginning with who? what? when? why? how? - they get longer and more interesting answers
- Be confident, don't be afraid of asking the same question again if you feel it hasn't been answered properly



During the interview

- Take charge
- Listen carefully to what your interviewee is saying, they might answer you next guestion before you have asked it
- Make and keep eye contact to show that they have your full attention Thank your interviewee

DO

- * Avoid closed questions
- * Ask open questions who? wha? when? why? how? why?
- * Be confident!



Don't

- * Ask complicated *questions*
- * Ask questions with incorrect facts
- * Ask questions that are too personal
